

Mifflintown Borough  
April 1, 2024

The borough council of Mifflintown met this date in the municipal building at 100 Cross Street, Mifflintown PA. The meeting was called to order by President Samuel Klinger at 7:00p. The following were in attendance: Samuel Klinger, Richard Zimmerman Jr, Mark Turns Jr. Brian Baker, Karen Haas, Robin Saner, Secretary/Treasurer, Mark Aurand, Maintenance, and Zina Klinger, meters. Mayor Roxan McGinnis was absent.

Zina gave her report as follows: fines collected for March were \$817.00; meter money was \$1029.17 for a total of \$1846.17 for the month. She wrote out 60 tickets.

Mark was up next. He reported on the many projects he had and completed such as the streets lights are set for daylight savings time; bleaches are painted; changed the dusk to dawn light at the playground; cleaned up various spots in the borough, etc. Fixed the garage doors and replaced the pole and painted cross walks. Mark asked about purchasing mulch. Motion was made and approved first by Zimmerman and second by Turns.

Minutes were approved first by Zimmerman and second by Turns. The treasurer's report was approved first by Zimmerman and second by Klinger.

In other correspondence it was approved to pay the Borough Association Dues of \$20; first by Zimmerman and second by Haas. The summer youth program was discussed. We can advertise at CareerLink and put on Google for free. Baker gave Saner the job description to use in the ads.

Although the mayor was absent, she gave a report through Zimmerman. The sign for the bridge dedication in June is done and she shared a picture of it. Also, the National Night Out event is coming right along.

As far as old business council agreed to put the 2024 street projects out for bid. Saner will talk to Matt Kenepf at PennDOT to get that started. It was approved to pay Nancy Zimmerman her vacation pay; first by Turns and second by Baker. Also mentioned was Saner's 90 Day Review which was then tabled until the May meeting. Spring Cleanup is set for May 28 & 29<sup>th</sup>.

The issue of hiring a codes enforcement officer was discussed. Council wants to discuss it with Mayor McGinnis. Klinger will talk to her.

Bills to paid was approved first by Baker and second by Turns.

The meeting ended at 8:10p. Motion was made; approved first by Baker and second by Turns.
