

Mifflintown Borough
June 3, 2024

The borough council of Mifflintown met this date in the municipal building at 100 Cross Street, Mifflintown PA. The meeting was called to order by Vice President Richard Zimmerman Jr at 7:20p. President Samuel Klinger was absent. The following were in attendance: Richard Zimmerman Jr., Mark Turns Jr., Brian Baker, Karen Haas, Mayor Roxann McGinnis, Robin Saner, Sec/Treas., Solicitor Randall Zimmerman, Mark Aurand, Maintenance, and Zina Klinger, meters. Steve Baumgardner, Milford Township Supervisor was in attendance also.

Steve was following up on some information that he had provided at the May meeting.

Solicitor Randy Zimmerman confirmed that paperwork is complete regarding the extension of the bridge grants. He also presented a proposed petition to reduce the size of council from 7 members to 5 members. The council gave authorization for President Klinger to sign the petition as 1st motion by Baker and then 2nd by Haas. The other council members will receive a copy of the petition to go around for signatures. Twenty-one signatures are required; however, Zimmerman would like to see 35 or more. The petition needs filed 15 weeks ahead of the election or August 1st. Zimmerman also asked for authorization for himself, Nancy, and Robin to locate files pertaining to the wire transfer payments on the new bridge. A motion to approve was made 1st by Baker and 2nd by Turns. The three of them will pick a date. It was also decided that McGinnis and Klinger will write recommendation letters for Hawbaker's who nominated the Cross Street Culvert Bridge for an Excellence in Construction Award.

Zina gave her report next. She wrote out 73 tickets which amounted to \$894 and the monthly meter deposit was \$1160.47 for a grand total of \$2054.47. Zina thanked the council for purchasing the paper shredder. Mark reported spring clean up was a success. We went through 5 trash dumpsters and 1 metal dumpster. The lines were painted downtown. He wanted to thank Councilmen Turns and Klinger for their help. He reported on the various projects he's been working on: spraying weeds, working at the park, etc. Mark will be on vacation from July 13-20th.


Mayor McGinnis talked about the Bravery Bridge Dedication on June 17, 2024. And the council agreed to sign the resolution for the America250PA. A motion was made 1st by Baker and 2nd by Turns to sign it then. Mayor McGinnis mentioned National Night Out on Aug. 6th. And that she presided over 2 weddings recently.

A motion was made to approve the May minutes; 1st by Turns, 2nd by Haas. A motion was made to approve the Treasurer's Report; 1st by Haas, 2nd by Turns. Saner informed council there was a Liquid Fuels Audit on Thursday, June 6th and a representative from H A Thomson was coming Monday, June 10th for a policy renewal meeting. The safe deposit box was closed. The only thing in the box was old deeds. They will be placed in our safe in the basement. Cleck's Paving won the bid the spring projects coming in at \$65,999 compared to Fulkroad's, the only other bidder, of \$73,834.59. I will send Cleck's a formal letter letting them know they got the project.

Due to the lack of interest for a Summer Youth Program Director the program is no longer. There wasn't any new news to report. So, then a motion was made to approve the "Bills to be Paid in June", 1st by Baker and 2nd by Haas.

Adjournment was at 8:25p after a motion was made 1st by Baker and 2nd by Turns.
